



One Month Before

- ✓ If you are working, talk to your employer and parents about getting two to three weeks off of work in January to focus on your exams.
- ✓ Manage your time so that extracurricular activities are not and will not be interfering with your reviewing.
- ✓ Make sure your notes are complete, up-to-date, and organized you may want to check with your teacher or a classmate who takes good notes, especially if you have some absences.
- ✓ Read through your notes and make sure you understand all the concepts ask for extra help if you don't understand.
- Begin reviewing your tests and quizzes redo the test questions (especially the ones you got wrong). Questions that appear on tests tend to appear on exams as well.

Two to Three Weeks before the Final

- ✓ Continue reviewing your notes. If needed, seek additional resources for further development of concepts (e.g. use your issued textbook, website documents).
- ✓ Make up flash cards for reviewing the concepts discussed in class.
- ✓ Make up your own questions and answers exchanged these with your classmates.
- ✓ Practice doing the diagram questions.

One to Two Weeks before the Final

- ✓ More specific information about the exam layout will be given to you.
- Continue reviewing notes from previous units ask for extra help with topics you feel you do not understand.
- ✓ Join/create a study group. Get together outside of class and teach each other the concepts. Work together on problems.
- ✓ Review the tests from previous units once again.
- ✓ Study until you feel confident.

Day/Night before the Final Exam

- ✓ Review one last time.
- ✓ Be confident, you've done lots of preparation by now.
- ✓ Gather all of the supplies you need: pencils, erasers, calculator, ruler, and protractor.
- ✓ Get a good night's rest and then a healthy/hearty breakfast.





During the Exam

- ✓ When permitted to start you should use scrap paper to jot down any information you've memorized.
- ✓ Glance through the exam and do the easy questions first. Remember to read the instructions carefully.
- ✓ Double check your answers do they match your understanding of the concepts?

Exam Expectations

- Students are required to stay in the exam room for a minimum of two hours.
- It is <u>not</u> permitted to listen to any device during the exam.
- It is <u>not</u> permitted to have a cell phone anywhere near your examination area. Cell phones may <u>not</u> be used for calling, texting, or as a music device <u>anytime</u> during the exam period. I will confiscate any cell phones I see during the examination period.
- You are <u>not</u> permitted to borrow a calculator get your own!
