## HOW TO BETTER UNDERSTAND A POEM IN 5 EASY STEPS (AKA"MPWLLF"):

- 1. Read through once, and circle any words you don't know. Find the MEANINGS. You can't understand a poem if you don't understand the words within it.
- 2.Remember that EVERY SINGLE piece of PUNC-TUATION matters in a poem. Which punctuation stands out? Note the way that commas, dashes, ellipsis, exclamation points, capitals, and any other punctuation is used.
- 3. Every WORD in a poem counts. Which words (or words) really stick out on the page? What might be the reason for that?
- 4. The LINE LENGTH even matters. Which lines are longer? Shorter? Why? What effect does it have on the way you read that line?
- 5. Note the FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE the poet uses. Simile, metaphor, personification, allusion, alliteration, onomatopoeia. How does it increase the value of what the poet is trying to say?
- \* Apply these steps to ANY poem, and you'll have no problems! Promise!
