About the Scholarship Fund

- This Memorial Scholarship Fund was created in 1990 by the Board of Directors of Potatoes New Brunswick in memory of Maurice Daigle.
- Maurice Daigle was a potato producer that lost his life as result of an accident at the age of 36. Maurice, along with
 his two brothers, farmed in the Saint-André area on a mixed farm (potatoes, grain and beef cattle). In addition to
 farming, Maurice was heavily involved in the advancement of agriculture and was a director on the board of Potatoes
 New Brunswick for several years.
- The Maurice Daigle Memorial Scholarship Fund is given annually to kin of eligible potato farmers in the province of New Brunswick who are pursuing post secondary education in agriculture or agriculture related field of study.

Eligibility Criteria:

- This Scholarship is offered to a student who is furthering his Agricultural Education at a University (or) College.
- Available for students whose parents are (or) were a registered growers with Potatoes New Brunswick.
- Applicants must be enrolled on a **full-time basis** and provide a **copy of enrollment** from College (or) University.

En plus de l'agriculture, Maurice a été très impliqué dans l'avancement de l'agriculture et a été membre de conseil d'administration de Pommes de terre Nouveau-Brunswick pendant plusieurs années.
