General Information

Atlantic Education International Inc. and the New Brunswick Department of Education and Early Childhood Development have been working with Concord College of Sino-Canada on various education initiatives since 1997. During this time, Atlantic Education International Inc. (AEI Inc.) has facilitated opportunities for more than 2000 Chinese students and teachers to travel to New Brunswick to participate in weeklong winter camps and semester-long Enhanced Programs. The Summer Camp program provides a reciprocal opportunity for New Brunswick students and teacher chaperones to explore China. Over 250 New Brunswick students have participated in summer camp at the Concord College of Sino-Canada since 1997. This exciting opportunity is a wonderful experience for students to become culturally sensitized and internationally aware of our global community and the open-minded attitude necessary to participate in it.

2013 Summer Camp Program

The 2013 Summer Camp will take place approximately July 4th to 18th. Students and chaperones will travel from New Brunswick to Beijing, where they will spend one week at the Beijing

Concord College of Sino-Canada (BCCSC) campus. The College will organize a program consisting of classroom instruction including introductory courses in Chinese culture, language, martial arts, etc. Participants will also visit major cultural and historic sites in the Beijing area including the Great Wall, Tiananmen Square, and The Forbidden City. At the same time, Chinese students will be taking part in an English language program. Activities will be scheduled so that New Brunswick and Chinese students



can join together in activities, to reinforce skills in both languages.

Students will also visit the Anhui Concord College and the Shenzhen Concord College. Upon arrival at these schools, a program of in-class activities, as well as field trip activities will be arranged.

Participants will then travel to Hong Kong for a one day tour and overnight before departing for Canada. What a trip!! Take a virtual tour of the campus at: www.ccsc.com.cn.

Accommodations and Meals



While in China, participants will be hosted by the Concord Colleges of Sino-Canada. The College will provide all accommodations and meals.

Participants will live in student dormitories on campus. These accommodations are similar to university dormitories in Canada. Two-to-four New Brunswick and Chinese students will be accom-

modated per room. Washroom and shower facilities exist on each floor/wing of the dormitory. These will be shared facilities. The female and male dormitories are separate. Each dormitory is chaperoned by a Chinese teacher/worker where dormitory rules are mandatory. New Brunswick chaperones are accommodated in the teacher's residence OR in student dormitories. All participants will eat in the College cafeteria. This is typical cafeteria-style Chinese food, not what you are used to in Canada! There will also be some opportunity to experience meals in Chinese res-

If you enjoy trying new activities, learning about cultures and languages, and if you don't mind trying new foods and sharing your space for a few weeks, this may be a great program for you!



Location of Concord College of Sino-Canada

The Beijing campus of Concord College of Sino-Canada is located in a residential suburb 20 kilometers due east of Tiananmen Square in the center of Beijing. As is the tradition in China, a wall surrounds the suburb with an archway as the entrance. The College is within a walled compound of about 17 acres. The school is equipped with a dance studio, gymnasium and swimming pool. The school is gated and students are allowed off campus when accompanied by a chaperone.

The Anhui campus is located in the city of Wuhu. The campus is also gated. The amenities of the school include an Olympic size swimming pool as well as a large

track for students to enjoy. Wuhu has a population of approximately 4 million people.

The Shenzhen campus is located in the Nanshan district. Shenzhen is a city of approximately 14 million people, and faces Hong Kong to the south. Similar to the Beijing campus, the Shenzhen campus is within a walled compound. Various facilities are available on campus for recreational activities. Student travel beyond this area without chaperones is not permitted.

Travel Arrangements

All air travel arrangements, Chinese Visa processing, orientation session planning, and distribution of information on Summer Camp, etc. will be made by Atlantic Education International Inc.

Aeroplan points or credit cards to purchase air ticket cannot be accommodated.

All students will require a Passport so apply ASAP!!

 30, 2013
- have been recommended by the school principal
- have exceptional academic, social and behavioral involvement in their schools
- have hosted or been directly involved in supporting Chinese student programs at your school

Students have been selected for the 2013 Summer Camp! 2013 Summer Camp students will receive an instant Scholarship of \$500.00 (applied to the air fare) and upon returning to New Brunswick with a good report from the chaperones AND a wonderful power point presentation OR Essay will receive an additional \$500.00.The total Scholarship in 2013 could be \$1000.00 for each student participating.
